Banking Supervision Training for Irag



As part of "Improving the Banking" Supervision Regulation Framework" project, METAC Banking Supervision Advisor, Mr. Mohamad Ali Hassan, completed a two-week mission in Beirut aimed at enhancing the capabilities of the Central Bank of Iraq (CBI) examiners and improving their skills in banking supervision.

The first part, January 10-14, provided training to CBI examiners on the new prudential regulations and related supervisory call reports which were developed by METAC in line with the requirements of Basel Committee on banking supervision and international best practices.

The regulations were approved and issued by the authorities in Iraq.

The second part, January 17-21, covered off-site supervision and the preparation of monthly and yearly reports for banks following the CAMELS approach.

FAD/WB/METAC joint mission in **Public Financial Management** (PFM) in Jordan

The mission was headed by Mr. Dimitar Radev, Senior Economist in the IMF Fiscal Affairs Department. METAC was represented by Mr. Pierre Messali, PFM Resident Advisor, and Mr. Subra Ramamurthy, short-term expert.
