Joint Banque du Liban – IMF Conference on Regional **Economic Outlook for the Middle East and North Africa**



On June 18, the Banque du Liban (BDL) and the IMF co-hosted a conference on the IMF's economic outlook for the countries in the Middle East and North Africa. The focus of the conference was the IMF's spring 2014 Regional Economic Outlook Update for the Middle East, North Africa, Afghanistan, and Pakistan. The conference was attended by people from the private and public sectors; international institutions; donor agencies; and the media.

Governor Riad Salamé gave remarks on the Lebanese economy and the monetary conditions in Lebanon. He stressed that the conservative banking model followed by the BDL, which separates investment banking from commercial banking has spared Lebanon many of the problems that some of the regional and emerging markets have been facing. He indicated that capital inflows remained strong and gross reserves held by the BDL reached about \$35 billion which gives the BDL the means and instruments to maintain both economic and financial stability. Mr. Mohamad Elhage, METAC Coordinator, discussed the IMF's assessment of the global economy and the current situation, outlook, and risks for the countries of the Middle East and North Africa. He stressed the IMF position on the actions needed to achieve sustainable and inclusive growth: (i) re-orienting public spending toward investment to kick-start job creation; (ii) improving fiscal sustainability; and (iii) embarking on structural reforms to raise potential growth, sustainably raise employment, and enhance equity.
